Quantitative Standard (Pace)

These intercalated programmes are comprised of 180 credits. Students must pass at least 67% of all attempted credits and remain on pace to graduate within the 150% maximum timeframe. The maximum timeframe for completion is 150% of the standard, published timeframe for an undergraduate course (see table below).

Programme

Programme Length in Credits placed on financial aid suspension. They will be notified of this by the Financial Aid Office, along with the procedure for appealing this determination (see Appeals).

Appeals

Students may appeal the decision of the Examination Board not to allow them to continue on the programme due to the failure to make satisfactory academic progress. The student may appeal the result on the basis of exceptional circumstances. The appeal must explain why they failed to make satisfactory academic progress and what has changed in their situation that will enable them to make satisfactory progress at the next evaluation.

Exceptional circumstances may include:

- a. Death or extended illness of an immediate family member (parent, spouse, sibling, dependent child).
- b. Extended illness or personal injury of the student.
- c. Other exceptional circumstances as determined by the Academic Registrar.

Students wishing to appeal the suspension of financial aid will be required to indicate why they believe financial aid should not be terminated and provide reasons for failing to meet the satisfactory academic progress requirements.

Students will also be required to supply documentary evidence in support of their appeal. This may include:

- · Copy of death certificate
- · Medical certificate from a registered doctor or psychiatrist
