## **Award & Assessment Regulations**

### **9. Consequences of Failure**

- 9.1. A candidate who fails overall at the first attempt due to failure to achieve 50% in Part 1 will be required to resit Part 1 (items i. to v. listed in 7.1. above.). If the candidate has achieved at least 50% in Part 2 these marks will be carried forward. If the candidate has achieved less than 50% in Part 2, they will be required to rework and resubmit the project (item viii in 7.1 above).
- 9.2. A candidate who fails overall at the first attempt due to Part 2 will be required to rework and resubmit the project (item viii. listed in 7.1 above). If the candidate has passed Part 1 these marks will be carried forward.
- 9.3. A candidate who has failed overall at the first attempt due to failure to achieve the required thresholds in both Part 1 and Part 2 will be required to retake both Parts as listed in 7.1 above.
- 9.4. A candidate who fails at the first attempt is required to take the resit or withdraw from the course. The overall mark obtained at the second attempt will be no greater than 50%.
