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8.2	<p>Resit</p> <p>Following rescaling of marks, students must:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">Gain an average mark of 50% or more aggregated from the marks listed under item 7 above <p>AND</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">Gain at least 40% for the ESSENTIAL KNOWLEDGE element (Written Paper 1) <p>AND</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">Gain at least 40% for the combined PROBLEM SOLVING AND INTERPRETATION elements (papers 2 & 3 plus ISF Oral) of the examinations <p>AND</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">Achieve a Pass Safe
9.	<p>Consequences of Failure</p>
9.1	<p>A student who fails at the first sit is required to take the resit or withdraw from the course. The mark obtained at the resit will be no greater than the mark obtained at the first sit.</p>
9.2	<p>Not yet safe</p> <p>Given a second opportunity to take those stations again in time to be considered at the next scheduled BVetMed Examination Board. Both of these opportunities will be classed as the first sit.</p>
9.3	<p>Not yet safe</p> <p>The second opportunity (first sit) will be given a second opportunity to take those stations again in time to be considered at the next scheduled BVetMed Examination Board. This opportunity will be classed as the first sit.</p>
9.4	<p>Not yet safe</p> <p>opportunity will only have to resit the specific DOPS station(s) that they failed.</p>
9.5	<p>A student who fails the resit will be required to withdraw from the course. They have a</p>
